

**Forest Hills Neighborhood Association
Annual Meeting Minutes
March 25, 2004**

Meeting was brought to order at 7:45 p.m. in the Perinton Community Center by Carol Menchel, President. She started with a review of what was accomplished this year. Lake Crescent pond and Westwood pond were taken care of. The Westwood pond area is not totally done but a lot of progress has been made.

Bill Holliday, Treasurer passed out a financial report to all present. A motion was made to accept the budget for next year and it was seconded and passed.

There will be a work day at the pond areas on May 1st at 9:00 a.m. There will be a neighborhood picnic on May 22nd at noon. An Easter Egg Hunt will be held on Saturday, April 10th at 10:00 a.m.

Carol asked those present to talk about things they liked about their own homes and things they would have done differently. It was agreed that replacement windows that go with the architecture of the house are expensive. It was also agreed that we all live in a wonderful neighborhood with nice neighbors and it truly is a delight to walk in our neighborhood.

Karin Kacprzynski introduced the speaker, Mr. Frank Fulreader, Jr. at 8:25 p.m. Mr. Fulreader developed the plans for the Lake Crescent Reforestation Project and the project was a beautiful success. He had some ideas to block the lights from 31F with other trees and/or tall ornamental grasses to increase the density and at the same time be cost effective. He answered questions and commended the neighborhood on a great job. Special thanks to the resident on Lake Crescent responsible for watering the newly planted trees. They would not have survived without that special care.
