

Forest Hill Executive Board Meeting, September 27, 2005 @ 23 Ridgeview Drive

- 1 Homeowners dues: 91 homes were billed, 71 paid in full and 2 partially, 9 homes are not in the refuse collection
- 2 Westwood Park: Tom reported that mulch and top soil has been delivered by the town and Jack Vienne is taking the responsibility to spread it around the roadside area. There needs to be a meeting to work out the Long-Term plans for the maintenance and reforestation of Lake Crescent Park and Westwood Park
- 3 Fall Garage Sale: Bill Holiday reported that over \$350.00 was received by the association and more is coming in.
- 4 Reception: November 4, 2005 is the date for the New Neighbor Reception at the Holidays.
- 5 Homeowner Association Membership: The question was raised as to whether membership in the association is voluntary or mandatory. The answer is somewhere between. Residents are expected to pay but there is no authority to mandate payment.
- 6 Reforestation Projects: The reforestation plan for Westwood Park needs to be fully developed in order to obtain Town approval and to have a schedule to execute the plan over a period of time. There was considerable discussion about the need to disseminate information about the plan, enough in advance so that neighbors can be informed and can contribute their ideas to the project. It was also pointed out that new neighbors need to be informed and educated. There is need for someone to chair the Westwood Park 5 year plan, Tom Hamilton and Karin Kacprzynski will participate on the committee.
- 7 Westwood pond project: The possibility of putting an aerator and fountain in the pond will cost +/- \$3,500 but is dependant on getting a 220 volt electrical circuit from pump station. The suggestion was made to call a meeting of interested individuals to work out a proposed and workable plan to solve the Westwood pond problems, including discussions about choice of fish. The cat tail project needs attention. The options are to hire their removal out or to rent waders and pull them out ourselves.
- 8 Forest Hills Neighborhood web site: Discussion centered on the possibility of developing a web site for distribution of information. Karin Kacprzynski, Chuck Sorce and Alex Neubert offered to work on developing such a site. Alex will take the lead on the project. It was pointed out that it is essential to have as many email addresses as possible. Minutes, agenda, reports will be part of the site inclusions.

- 9 Road Resurfacing: Tom Quinn has agreed to stay in touch with the Town and follow the design and schedule for the road rebuilding project. Tom has spoken with Tom Beck who indicated that replacement should take place in 3 to 5 years. In the mean time, maintenance will be done. When the road is replaced, a pump and force main will be installed to control the water level in the Westwood pond.
- 10 Tom Beck has indicated that early this spring the town will be renting a long armed excavator that they will use to dredge the Lake Crescent pond, where they can get access on the perimeter of the pond.
- 11 Fall Cleanup: Bill Holiday will take the lead in organizing the clean-up in the Westwood Park. Peter Schenek and Tom Hamilton will lead in organizing the Lake Crescent Park clean-up.
- 12 Ice Skating on the Lake Crescent pond: Tom Hamilton will discuss with Mike Robinson and Jan Horton whether the bubblers can be shut down for the winter so the ice will be safe for the neighborhood can skate on the pond.
- 13 Luminaria: It was reported that plans are underway for the luminaria Christmas eve display. All neighbors will be contacted in early November. A group is meeting on October 3rd to organize the project.
- 14 Pumpkin Hunt: Judy Lawther has organized the pumpkin hunt in the past. Karin will check to see if Judy will head this up again. They eill set a date. Any interested families should contact Judy or Karin.
- 15 The annual meeting: April 6, 2006 at the Perinton Recreational Center.
