

**Forest Hills Neighborhood Association
Annual Meeting**

Thursday, April 23, 2009

An annual meeting of the Forest Hills Neighborhood Association was held at the Perinton Town Hall on Thursday, April 23, 2009. The meeting was called to order at 7:30 p.m.

Present were Tom Quinn (President), Linda & Ed Dunn (Treasurer), Alex Neubert (Secretary) and the following street representatives: Colleen Robinson, Dan Bogdan, Ken Dodson and Jay Sackett. In addition, approximately 34 neighbors were in attendance representing 28 households. 12 households voted by proxy.

Before the business meeting began, Tom introduced the officers and street reps and thanked everyone for their time, dedication and service to the neighborhood. He then took a moment to recap and review for everyone the events of 2008. He noted the Easter Egg Hunt, the Block Party, the Scarecrow Festival and the Luminaria Festival and how each event seems to be growing in popularity.

Tom Quinn then called the business meeting to order. The first item of business was a review of the Association's financial report. Tom turned this portion of the meeting over to the Association's Treasurers, Linda and Ed Dunn. Ed Dunn went through and explained the proposed 2008/2009 proposed budget. He noted that our annual homeowners dues were decreased to \$100 and that the annual Waste Management fee was also decreased to \$238.

In responses to questions, both Tom and Ed advised the group of additional work (plantings) to be done in Lake Crescent and that a number of neighbors had expressed an interest in picnic tables, park benches, etc. Tom indicated that the Town was approached and that they don't have an issue with this as long as nothing is permanently mounted into the ground. The group discussed various ways to control the geese population in the pond and Bill Shaw explained that he has looked into options such as a perimeter fence, oiling the eggs, or a border collie. Tom advised the group that in addition to certain work to be done in Westwood (duck weed control, tree trimming) that the street signs are approaching need for repair and should be monitored closely. Chuck Sorce mentioned the idea of engaging a tree service to visit the neighborhood and offer bulk-rate pruning or trimming. Tom Hamilton noted that neighbors have been working to build a walking path and arboretum down through Foothill Terrace and that neighbors are welcome to join in the work or take advantage of the walking path. Tom Quinn mentioned that the Town is still planning to install asphalt gutters in the neighborhood to help control runoff and washing away but that it isn't a top priority for the Town. The South Lincoln Road Project was discussed and how it might affect traffic in the neighborhood. It was also noted that the date of the Garage Sale has been moved from September 12th to August 29th, 2009.

Ballots were collected. The group discussed the need for a Vice President and Pat Farchione graciously agreed to serve as the Association's Vice President. After voting took place and a review of the ballots was made, it was determined that the proposed 2009/2010 budget was approved and passed unanimously. All officers and street reps were also voted into office.

The 2009 annual business meeting of the Forest Hills Neighborhood Association was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
